### YOUTH AGRICULTURE PROJECTS GET \$30,000 IN FUNDING

Thanks to the Kentucky Agricultural Development Fund (KADF) and approved by the Warren County Agriculture Development Board, 48 Warren County youth are sharing \$30,000 in 50-50 cost share funding. This is the 4<sup>th</sup> year that the Warren County 4-H Council has administered this program. Letters have already gone out to youth who

were approved to receive a 50-50 cost share reimbursement of up to \$625 back for agriculture projects. If you missed the application deadline, check us out for next year. ### NUTRITION TIPS FOR KIDS

There is a lot of advice for kids' eating habits. The USDA recommends following these simple tips:

- Eat more fruit and vegetables. Make half your plate fruits and veggies every day.
- Try whole grains. Add things like oatmeal and wholewheat bread and pasta to your dishes.
- Think about your drink. Choose water and low-fat or fat-free dairy milk (or lactose-free or fortified soy versions) when you're thirsty.
- Mix up your protein foods. Include different foods like seafood, beans, peas, lentils, nuts, seeds, soy products, eggs, meats, or poultry.
- Involve kids in the kitchen. Let them help by putting away groceries, stirring ingredients, peeling fruits, or setting the table.
